

Plans for Scotland's first new University campus for the 21st Century, to be built at Craighall, Musselburgh

Queen Margaret University College is planning to move to Musselburgh, bringing many economic benefits to the town and also providing exciting new facilities for the community to enjoy.

This exhibition shows the proposed layout for the 35-acre site at Craighall, and artist's impressions of how the new campus might look when it is built.

The aim is to create a vibrant new 21st century academic village with high-tech buildings and attractive landscaped parkland spaces. In addition, there will be cafes, shops, health clinics utilising clinical expertise, and sports and leisure facilities. Members of the local community will be encouraged to use the facilities on offer at the new campus, including the Learning Resource Centre which forms the heart of the campus.

These plans have been developed following initial

consultancy with the community. In particular, environmental issues have been fully considered and the aim is to create a green environment in which to live and work. From construction, to future operation and maintenance, sustainability is at the heart of every aspect of this project from creating homes for local wildlife to providing plenty of open green space for everyone to enjoy.

Building is due to start in summer 2005, with completion in 2007.

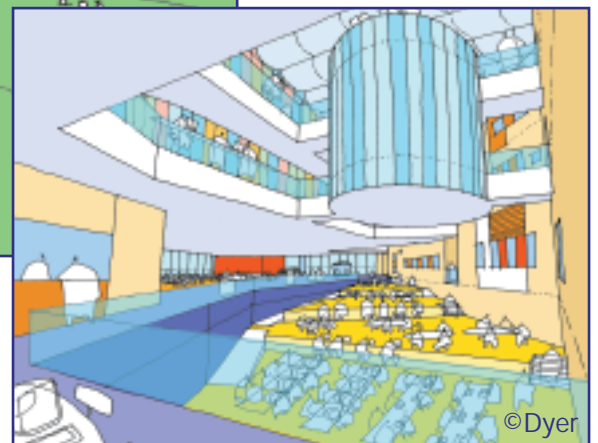
