DELIVERY

The course will be convened by Dr. Arek Dakessian, with guest lectures, panel discussions and case studies from members of the IGHD's Migration, Integration and Social Connections research group as well as policy and practice partners.

Lectures will be grounded in real-life contexts, focused on real-world applications and informed by the latest developments in research, policy and practice.

The course will be delivered in a blended learning environment, with face-to-face lectures and online learning.

Participants registered on the course will work through three units of material featuring readings, eight lecture and discussion sessions (face-to-face or, for those accessing remotely, broadcast online), practitioner panels and a video seminar series - *Between Two Screens* - over a four-week period. Those wishing to gain academic credit for study will then complete one group assignment and one written assignment.
