Engagement Meeting

QMU and AUB researchers liaise with stakeholders in Beirut









RUHF researchers taking part in the group-discussions during the Stakeholder Meeting held in Beirut between 28 and 29 March.

Global Health researchers from the <u>NIHR Research Unit on Health in Fragility</u> (<u>RUHF</u>), at Queen Margaret University (QMU) and key stakeholders involved in the provision of health services to address non-communicable diseases and mental health problems in Lebanon gathered in a two-day meeting in Beirut last month to identify priority research interventions to improve healthcare services among Syrian refugees and host communities in Lebanon.

Around thirty stakeholders, including representatives from the Ministry of Public Health, United Nations agencies (UNHCR, UNFPA) and the Lebanese Red Cross, among other organisations, attended the meetings. Coordination between private and public agents, effective accountability and local and contextualised research were identified as priority actions.

RUHF researchers seek to understand how Salvadorian patients with chronic diseases, such as diabetes and kidney disease, use health services and, where and who they ask for help within their communities.
