# 1.0 INTRODUCTION

Dear Colleague,

I am pleased to provide my fifth annual report regarding the 2011-2012 activities of the International Centre for the Study of Planned Events. This report is being drafted on the national day of the United States and coincidentally the same date that Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II officially opened the new campus of Queen Margaret University in 2008.

In 1976, the United States of America celebrated its bi-centennial with a year long programme of events that were held throughout every state and territory. This celebration marked one of the first times the federal government of the United States provided massive funding to local governments for the purpose of creating and developing new events to commemorate and celebrate a national day. As a result of the injection of funds, many of these local events are still celebrated over 35 years later.

The International Centre for the Study of Planned Events was founded in 2008 with the mission of providing event planners and governments with the research and technical assistance to increase the capacity and quality of planned events throughout the world. Four years later, I am pleased to report, that we are on precisely target to achieve these goals.

• Christopher Preston published Event Marketing, second edition (John Wiley & Sons, NY) in 2011. This is the leading text book in the field of events marketing and has recently been translated into Mandarin for publication in the P.R. China,

• Sam Goldblatt published Greener Meetings and Events (John Wiley & Sons, NY) in 2011. This book is the first book in the field of sustainable development for meetings and events,

• Professor Joe Goldblatt contributed a chapter entitled Temporal Retail Events for a book edited by Charles McIntyre (Tourism and retail: The psychogeography of liminal consumption, Routledge 2012),

• Seung-won Lee and Professor Joe Goldblatt published two refereed journal articles in the International Journal of Festival and Event Management and Tourism Research International,

• Kuan-wen Lin, Patrick Stein and Professor Joe Goldblatt published a refereed journal article in Event Management, an International Journal,
