## Information

NES have created a **Peer Assisted Learning (PAL)** education package, to support learning, for AHP practice educators and those interested in supporting practice-based learning placements in Scotland.

The aim of the learning is to provide participants with the knowledge and skills required for planning, delivering and evaluating a PAL placement.

The learning is designed to take place as an [Education package](#) and is split into three sections:

1. An **introductory online presentation** (10 minutes)
2. A **main online presentation** (1 hour)
